RENTAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PART 1

1. **RENTAL PERIOD:** _____ day minimum with pickup on _____ and return on _____. Pickup time is between _____ and return time is _____ **SHARP!**

The renter will be charged \$25. per hour for a vehicle returned late and a full days rate for every 8 hours returned late. No refunds for early returns.

REMEMBER – Other people may be waiting for the vehicle. Please contact our office if you are going to be delayed. No vehicle may be picked up or returned between hours of 6PM and 8AM. After hours service fee of \$200 will be applied.

2. **RESERVATION DEPOSIT:** 25% Required on all rentals: **THE RESERVATION DEPOSIT IS NOT REFUNDABLE.**

3. **SECURITY DEPOSIT:** \$1,500 required 3 days prior to departure. Refundable within 30 business days of return providing the vehicle is clean (inside and outside), holding tanks are empty, gas tank is full and the vehicle is not damaged or abused.

4. **Gasoline tanks** are released full and must be returned full. If not, the renter will be charged the cost of gas at _____ \$7 _____ per gallon.

5. A **dumping fee** of _____ \$150 _____ will be charged if the holding tanks are not empty upon return, unless prior arrangements were not made.

6. A _____ \$100 _____ sanitation fee will be charged for pets not previously authorized before rental departure

7. **WINTERIZING FEE:** \$100 Required on all winter rentals. This fee is not refundable.

8. All fees are payable by **CASH, CERTIFIED BANK CHECK, TRAVELERS CHECK OR ON A MAJOR CREDIT CARD (MASTERCARD OR VISA). WE DO NOT ACCEPT PERSONAL CHECKS.** Full payment is due on day of departure ie, balance of rental fee, security and cleaning deposits, estimated mileage charge, insurance waiver, winterizing fee, etc. Fees are subject to a State Sales Tax of 6%. If the final payment is made on MasterCard or Visa. Arrangements must be made prior to day of departure.

9. If breakdowns occur and repairs are needed: Any repair under _____ \$400 _____ may be done. Any repair over _____ \$400 _____ must have prior authorization from dealer. Please save and submit all receipts for repairs. **Refunds will not be made without a receipt.**

10. If involved in an accident you must notify dealer within 24 hours. A full written police accident report must be submitted to our management upon your return. Failure to comply will result in the forfeiture of your security deposit. Absolutely no one (including the driver) may move about the coach while it is in motion. All passengers must be seated and belted. The same rules and law as apply as they do in your passenger car.

11. Proper identification, employment, credit references, and a valid drivers license must be presented when reserving vehicle. **ALL INFORMATION WILL BE VERIFIED.**

12. **ALL DRIVERS MUST BE 25 YEARS OF AGE.**

13. Complete operating instructions will be given at time of departure. It will take approximately 1-2 hours. A more convenient time may be scheduled.

14. We reserve the right to refuse any applicant.

15. **TERMS AND RATES SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE.** Any additional terms will be disclosed at the time of the rental agreement is signed.

RENTAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PART 2

1. No Refunds for Early Returns: If you return early we do not refund the days you will not use. This includes if you have an accident or crash in the unit; however, if the crash is not your fault you may be able to recover your rental costs from the at-fault driver's liability insurance
2. Fee for Late Returns: If you are late returning the unit there is a full-day charge every 8 hours late fee. You will also be responsible for the cost of any canceled rentals due to your late return. All drivers must be at least 25 years old and must be listed on the contract when you pick up the unit. NO EXCEPTIONS
3. Absolutely no one may be inside a travel trailer while it is being towed. If you're in a motor coach, no one (including the driver) may move about the coach while it is in motion. All passengers must be seated and secured by a seatbelt. The same rules and laws apply as they do in your passenger car
4. Campground Reservations. We are not responsible for campground reservations. All campground reservations must be made separately with the campground's reservation agency. All campground and campsite fees are separate from and in addition to the rental price and fees under this Agreement. No refunds will be given for campsite reservation errors
5. NO SMOKING: Smoking (including cigars, pipes, drugs, etc) in the unit forfeits your entire security deposit
6. NO DRUGS: Any evidence of the storage, transportation, or use of illegal substances will forfeit your entire security deposit. Travel trailers returned with any evidence of drug use or transportation will result in law enforcement being called for a report and to collect the evidence
7. Odors / Cooking: We do not allow anything that can create a strong smell in the RV that is difficult to remove, such as raw fish storage or cooking with heavy spices such as curry or strong gumbo.
8. Travel Restrictions: Travel trailers are NOT allowed to travel outside of Pennsylvania unless previously approved. Motorhomes are NOT allowed to travel outside of the United States. No travel allowed on any non-paved roadways like logging roads, forest service roads, beaches, etc. Only exception to this is a non-paved road inside a licensed RV Park
9. Toll Roads (excluding EZ Pass), Red Light Cameras, parking tickets, etc: Parking Tickets, Mailed Violations, and Toll invoices are a major burden and we charge a \$75 fee for each invoice we get. Responsibility for traffic or parking violations will be transferred to you and you will be charged a \$75 administration fee. If you want to use Toll Roads, you are free to pay at the plazas, just make sure no invoices or toll by plate, etc mail comes our way or the \$75 administration fee will apply! Note: Most toll agencies are good to work with and will help you out if a mistake and call them right away.
10. Awnings: We discourage the usage of the exterior awning. This is for your protection because they are at a minimum of \$3,000 to replace. They can be damaged very

easily due to weather or accidental misuse. The awning IS NOT COVERED by insurance Damage to the awning, including damage while driving (tree, toll plaza, etc) are 100% your responsibility and will exceed your security/damage deposit amount.

11. Generators: Generators are for running the electrical elements of the trailer. They are not “constant run” generators and are not designed or allowed to be used as primary power while you are camping by running them constantly for extended periods of time. If you desire air conditioning you need to use a campsite with RV electrical available to plug into. Customers are forbidden from running the generator overnight while sleeping in the unit due to the possibility of carbon monoxide getting into the unit while you are asleep – a deadly hazard. You are responsible for the gas in portable generators. Any gas we have to replace will be charged at \$5 per gallon if not brought back full. On board generators are permitted to run for 4 hours per day. Any time beyond that will be charged at a rate of \$4 per hour.
12. Propane: Propane is used for cooking, heating, and sometimes for hot water. During the summer, you will be provided with at least 1 full 20# bottle of propane on travel trailers, and at least a half a tank of propane on motor coaches, full tanks in the winter.. Should you run out of propane during your trip, you will be responsible for filling them.
13. Pets: Pets are family and you are more than welcome to take them with you on your adventures at no additional charge. However, you MUST have approval from us before allowing a pet in the RV. If we reached an agreement on having a pet, an extra cleaning fee may apply. Many renters are allergic to pets so we must charge extra because it takes a lot of work to clean the RV after a pet has been in it to remove all the pet hair, dander, and sanitize every surface. Our current pet cleaning fee is \$100 for the entire rental period
14. Security Deposit: Your security deposit is refunded after the unit is checked in and there is no damage or issues requiring funds from the deposit. Failure to accurately report your destination or giving a false destination in order to attend a prohibited event will result in forfeiture and total loss of your security deposit.
15. Training: When you pick up the RV we will complete a pre-rental orientation of the unit that will take about 20 minutes to an hour depending on any prior experience you have with a RV. Picking up a RV is not like picking up a rental car so please plan at least 30 minutes for this when you make your plans
16. Cleaning: We currently do not offer a cleaning service so the coach must be returned with a clean interior and empty tanks. “Clean” means as you received it & ready for another rental. If the coach is “trashed” or so dirty that it is filled with trash or dirty beyond what is reasonable for a vacation, we will charge for a cleaning service to clean it and you will be charged that fee plus \$50 administrative fee
17. Damage/Minor Repairs: If the RV and/or the contents inside the RV at the time of the delivery orientation or damaged during your rental period, you are responsible to pay all damage costs whether you were at fault or not, or if damage was caused by acts of nature (wind, rain, earthquake, fire, food, etc). If an accident occurs, you are responsible for obtaining a police report, contacting the other party’s insurance company and contacting Mike Maxwell immediately at 717-525-3954.
18. a. Any damages need to be reported to us immediately. If the potential repair is minor, you may make the repair after consulting us. Replacement of defective parts and receipt must be brought back for reimbursement. There will be NO reimbursement if you do not bring back the defective part you replaced and the

receipt. If you purchase an item necessary due to an equipment failure (sewer or water hose, etc) the item you purchased and the receipt must be surrendered upon return if you want reimbursement.

19. Appliances. The A/C, generator, awning, radio, microwave, television, jacks, etc. are convenience items. If any malfunctions should occur with any of these items, no compensation will be made to you. For assistance, you are advised to call the emergency contact, Mike Maxwell at 717-525-3954.
20. Waste Holding Tanks: Waste holding tanks must be emptied prior to return & valves left OPEN. When you return the RV we will close the valves which is our way of making sure the tanks are empty. Putting anything other than human waste or RV toilet paper (supplied) in the toilets will result in an extra cleaning fee of \$250 in addition to the dump tanks fee listed below. If you don't want to flush the tanks you can select the dump fee below.
21. Rental Period: The rental period will be decided on a per-rental basis. Times will be discussed when making the reservation.
22. Personal Property. You release Mike Maxwell, Ultimate Family Glamping Adventures, and our agents from all claims for loss of, or damage to, your personal property or that of any other person, that was left or carried in or on the Trailer, whether or not the loss or damages was caused by our negligence or was otherwise our responsibility.
23. Personal Injury. You release Mike Maxwell, Ultimate Family Glamping Adventures, and our agents from all claims for injury, including, without limitation, personal, bodily, or mental injury, economic loss or damage to you, guests, unborn children, or relatives, whether or not the injury was caused by use of the Trailer, our negligence, or was otherwise our responsibility.
24. Extra fees: If you did not elect extra fees at the time of booking, such as the cleaning fee, flushing fee, and etc., you can elect to have them deducted from your deposit.
25. Waiver. Our failure to enforce any of our rights under this Agreement or at law shall not be deemed a waiver or a continuing waiver of any rights or remedies against another party, unless such waiver is in writing and signed by the party to be charged.
26. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is judicially determined to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
27. Attorneys' Fees. In the event a dispute arises regarding this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorney's fees and costs, in addition to other relief to which it is entitled.
28. Modifications. No term of this Agreement can be waived or modified except by a writing that we have signed.
29. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties regarding the rental of the Trailer, and supersedes all prior oral or written agreements or understandings regarding this subject matter. This Agreement can only be amended by a writing signed by all parties.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

_____ I understand this is a rental unit and I should not expect it to be in pristine condition. I am fully aware it will show wear and tear, sometimes severe. I expect some defects that include, but not limited to, stains on the floor, paneling peeling, malfunctioning lights, door hinges/locks, etc. I understand that UFGA would never knowingly send a unit out that has any major defects that would affect safety.

_____ I acknowledge I have been made aware that all rental units are monitored by GPS tracking. Any attempt to remove, tamper with, block signal, remove power, etc. will result in a \$200 replacement fee. GPS monitoring is non negotiable and if you wish to terminate your rental for this reason, you will forfeit all of your rental fees per our cancelation policy.

_____ I understand if the black and gray waste tanks are not emptied prior to returning, I will be charged a \$150 fee deducted from my security deposit.

_____ I understand that I am allotted 100 miles per night during the rental period. Anything over that will be deducted from the security deposit at a rate of \$0.40 per mile. (Only applies to motor homes)

_____ I understand that I am allotted 4 hours per day of generator use during the rental period. Anything over that will be deducted from the security deposit at a rate of \$4 per hour. (Only applies to motor homes. Rental of a portable generator for travel trailers not included)

_____ I understand I must return the coach with a full tank of gas. If it is not returned with a full take of gas, I will be charged a rate of \$7 per gallon from my security deposit.

_____ I understand the motor coach is equipped with an EZ Pass and any tolls I acquire will be deducted from my security deposit.

FEES ADDENDUM

BY SIGNING THIS ADDENDUM AND ACCEPTING KEYS, YOU UNDERSTAND THERE ARE EXTRA FEES THAT CAN OCCUR IF THE CONTRACT IS NOT ADHERED TO. THESE FEES, IF ASSESSED, WILL BE DEDUCTED FROM YOUR SECURITY DEPOSIT.

KEY REPLACEMENT \$50 CHARGE WILL BE ASSESSED IF ALL KEYS ARE NOT RETURNED.

SHORE-POWER ELECTRICAL CORD REPLACEMENT \$150 TO REPLACE DAMAGED ELECTRICAL SHORE POWER CORD. \$50 TO REPLACE 15 AMP ADAPTER.

SEWER HOSE REPLACEMENT \$150 TO REPLACE LOST OR MISPLACED SEWER HOSE AND/OR ADAPTERS.

CLEANING \$50/HR (1HR MINIMUM) FOR ANY EXTRA CLEANING REQUIRED AFTER RETURN. THE COACH SHOULD BE RETURNED IN THE SAME CONDITION AS IT WAS AT PICK-UP.

SMOKING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED. SMOKING IN THIS UNIT WILL BE CAUSE FOR FORFEITURE OF ALL SECURITY DEPOSITS AND MAY WARRANT ADDITIONAL FEES.

PETS AUTHORIZED IN WRITING AT TIME OF BOOKING, OR OTHERWISE ARRANGED, ARE WELCOME IN OUR RV'S AT NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE. WE DO NOT BELIEVE IN CAGING OR CRATING ANIMALS. YOU ARE WELCOME TO ALLOW THEM TO ROAM FREELY AS LONG AS YOU ARE COMFORTABLE WITH IT, BUT SHOULD ANY DAMAGE OCCUR BECAUSE OF YOUR PETS, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE. INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, URINE OR WASTE STAINS, CLAW/SCRATCH/CHEW MARKS, DAMAGE TO FURNITURE, EXCESSIVE CLEANING FEE. A \$100 FEE WILL BE ASSESSED FOR EACH UNAUTHORIZED PET.

RENTAL CHECK LIST

We've tried to think of everything in assembling information which you might find of value in renting a recreational vehicle and planning your trip. In case we've missed something, don't hesitate to ask. It is important to remember that the owner thinks very highly of his RV and wants it returned in the same condition that you received it. In effect, you are renting a home on wheels so treat it with respect.

MECHANICAL OPERATION OF THE MOTORHOME

ENGINE COMPARTMENT: Basically, this is the same as your car. If in doubt about any portion of the front compartment, let your service station attendant do the servicing. **IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT** that you keep a sharp eye on the engine temperature and pressure gauges. If there is anything abnormal, shut the engine down. Better safe than sorry.

WATER AND OIL: It is necessary to check water and oil each time in refueling. If traveling in excessive hot weather and engine is overheating, **STOP!**

FAN BELTS: If a fan belt breaks, do not keep traveling because the engine will overheat if the fan is not operating. Replace the fan belt.

TIRES - CHECK TIRES EACH TIME YOU STOP - Especially the rear duals, as you could have a flat and not know it thereby putting yourself in danger of fine and ruining the tire, and or the wheel.

STOW OUTSIDE STEP BEFORE MOVING MOTORHOME: The reason being, the step makes the motorhome wider than eight feet wide which is the legal limit, and you could receive a ticket. Also in the down position the step can be damaged and that is the lessee's responsibility.

FUEL TANKS: They are 40 to 70 gallons, depending on the size of the motorhome you have. Your mileage will depend on your driving habits. If you keep your speed down to 45 or 50 mph, you may

get 6 to 8 mpg on your fuel. Anything over 50 mph and you can figure on lowering your mileage to 5 to 7 mpg. All propane must be shut off when fueling the motorhome.

GENERATOR: (Power plant) located in the rear of the motorhome. Generator can be running while your motorhome is traveling. To have 110 volt power for lights and air conditioner on the roof, generator must be running. Generator switch to start and stop is usually located on the dash of the motorhome or can be near the monitor panel. All lights are 12 volt. The 12 volt runs off the battery and should not be left on or the battery will run down. If the battery should run down, start the generator and it will charge the battery. If you have any problems starting the generator, attempt to start it in the rear compartment by choking it with the throttle linkage. If you still have problems, call for further assistance.

PROPANE: The tanks will be completely full upon your departure and you must refill them before you return. Should you run out of propane (which is unlikely as there is enough in the tanks for 4 to 6 weeks) check the yellow pages in your immediate area under motorhome services. Make sure that you are out of propane and that the pilot light has not gone out. If it is propane, your oven, stove and refrigerator will not light. Do not attempt to fill the tanks yourself, go to a professional.

TOILET, SEWER SYSTEM, HOLDING TANK: To empty holding tank... On driver's side underneath the motorhome is where the drain for holding tank is located. At the rear of the motorhome either in the bumper or right beneath the bumper, the sewer drain hose is located. Take the sewer hose and attach to holding tank drain. Attach the other end to a dumping facility. Open valve to drain holding tank. Same operation applies when hooking to sewer facilities in a park and leave valve open at all times. When holding tank is empty, replace sewer drain hose and replace sewer tank cap. You can visually see when holding tank is reaching full by flushing toilet and looking down the drain. While draining holding tank, run water through toilet bowl and into tank to flush out residue in tank. **WHEN YOU RETURN THE MOTORHOME, BE SURE HOLDING TANKS ARE EMPTY.**

REFRIGERATOR: MOTORHOME MUST BE LEVEL FOR REFRIGERATION TO OPERATE. Refrigeration pilot can go out. It must be relit to operate. The outside temperature must be taken into consideration regarding full efficiency of the refrigerator. Continually opening and closing refrigerator door will lessen the efficiency and raise the temperature inside the refrigerator. It is suggested that you place the refrigerator on the electric mode when hooked up to outside electricity.

RECHARGE TOILET: When holding tank has been drained, take package of chemicals and put down toilet drain while flushing the toilet. In most cases, shower and sink water does not go into sewer holding tank. Most motorhomes have 2 separate holding tanks.

POWER FAILURE: If you have an electrical power failure be sure to check breaker switches and or fuses that may apply, located inside or outside of motorhome. Breaker switch shuts off automatically if becoming overloaded with air conditioners and appliances. If you have difficulty locating breakers, the owners manuals will help you locate them.

LOADING UP: When loading, don't create road-handling problems by concentrating heavy items on one side, or at the rear or overhead. Items stored in overhead cabinets, especially heavy objects, can fly out in a panic stop or collision. It is a good idea to place in a plastic bin any bottles that may break and spill liquids.

THE FOLLOWING TIPS CAN PREVENT DAMAGE AND SAVE YOU MONEY

WHEN BACKING UP: ALWAYS HAVE SOMEONE AT THE REAR OF THE MOTORHOME TO CHECK FOR CLEARANCE. There can always be an object such as a short post that would be impossible to see from the side mirrors and much damage results when the bumper is caught on such items. When you take your RV into boondock areas for hunting or fishing, always point the vehicle headed out toward the road. Then, should an emergency require quick departure, you lose no time maneuvering to turn the vehicle around, or risk getting bogged down or backing off the road into a ditch in the darkness.

EMERGENCY ROOF EXITS: Are to be opened only in the event of an emergency. They are easily cracked if not opened properly and closed in the same manner.

ALL OUTSIDE ACCESS DOORS TO OUTSIDE COMPARTMENTS ARE TO BE LOCKED, LATCHED OR SECURED - TO PREVENT ANY LOST ITEMS STORED INSIDE THEM.

LOCK ENTRY DOOR FROM INSIDE BEFORE TRAVELING: The door can come open while moving and do damage to the door as well as the motorhome.

SECURE REFRIGERATOR DOOR: If food or bottles are not stored properly in the refrigerator, upon opening after traveling they will fall out and possibly stain the carpeting.

WHAT TO DO IF...

WATER BACKS UP INTO THE SHOWER: The holding tank for waste-water from shower and sinks is probably full. If you are not near a dumping station, you can run excess water into a large pail placed beneath the waste-water (not the sewage) outlet while at a campground. But before you leave the campground, carry the pail to an emptying facility. Because some campers have spoiled campsites by pouring waste-water on them, some states outlaw use of the open pail for this purpose.

YOU HEAR A MOTOR CUTTING OFF AND ON ALL NIGHT: It is probably the water pump, installed in many motorhomes to pressurize the water system. Turn off the switch, and make sure all faucets are turned off.

YOU HAVE A FLAT TIRE: Call in a pro with a strong back and good equipment. He can jack up the vehicle and handle the heavy wheels easily.

YOU TURN ON THE FAUCET AND WATER SPUTTERS OUT: It is probably caused by air in the water tank or lines. Turn on the water pump and open a faucet and let it run to clear the air from the lines. **MAKE SURE YOU DO NOT RUN THE WATER TANK EMPTY WITH THE PUMP ON, THIS COULD CAUSE AIR IN THE LINES AND BURN OUT THE WATER PUMP.**

We have a variety of motorhomes and each and every one is different in some respect. If the above hints do not apply to your particular rental, then check the manual for further details and information.

Please remember these are machines and are subject to Murphy's Law which is "If anything can go wrong, it will." So treat it with respect, try to learn a little about it in the short time you have it and I'm sure you will enjoy it and have a minimum amount of problems.

NOTE THIS IS NOT AN OFF-ROAD VEHICLE. IF YOU TAKE IT OFF-ROAD, YOU STAND TO LOSE CONSIDERABLE MONEY IN REPAIR BILLS.

Enough for the first couple of days or so - buy as you go. Use plastic or other disposable containers for dining or food storage. Remember seasonings. You also may want to include limited supply of emergency food rations (candy bars, dried meats & fruit, etc.).

9. CLOTHING TIPS

One "good" outfit for each traveler (hang in plastic bag in closet). Remember - it can get cold in the morning even during the summer. Send for information on areas you are going to visit and plan your wardrobe accordingly.
