No off-road or dry camping permitted. Small pets (under 25 lbs.) are allowed. Please notify us that a pet will be joining the family. If it is a larger breed, please clear that in advance. Please DO NOT allow your pets on the furniture. A pet cleaning fee of \$50 will be added upon return to cover extra cleaning needs. Please, no smoking :)

If you will be towing the vehicle yourself, please check your electrical connection. The hook-up requires a 7-way flat. You should also have electric brake assist available. We do allow the use of our hitch, stabilizers, and sway bar. Please note, you should not back up with the sway bar engaged or tightened.

Basic Camping Needs

A list of basic camping needs will vary widely depending on the level of camping you are planning to do.



This is a selection of items you might want whether camping in a tent, camper, or RV.

- First aid kit—it's advisable to always keep one in your car, as well.
- Bug spray or citronella candles and sunscreen
- Batteries
- Flashlight, camping lantern, or phone with a light
- Camera or phone with camera
- Compass or phone with compass
- Maps or GPS
- Several days' worth of water—for drinking, cooking, and clean up
- Phone charger, preferable a charging bank in case power is unavailable
- Camping chairs
- Swiss Army or pocketknife
- Tool set including a hammer, saw or axe—for firewood, tire set with jack
- Tarps, ropes, bungee straps, and duct tape

Many of these items are for sale at the main office of some RV parks or campgrounds. It is a good idea to obtain knowledge of the destination and what amenities it offers.

Personal Camping Needs

When packing clothing and other personal items, it is better to be fully prepared for any and all temperatures and weather conditions. Some areas, although hot during the day can become fatally cold at night for an unprepared camper.

- Hiking shoes or boots
- Athletic shoes
- Shower shoes—for use in public shower facilities
- Long and short pants—during summer anyway
- T-shirts, sweatshirts or flannels, and a jacket
- Socks and under garments
- Sleepwear
- Bathing suit
- Hat or cap
- Rain gear—coat, boots, hat, umbrella
- Personal medications and vitamins
- Glasses, sunglasses, contact lenses, and solution
- Shampoo, soap, toothbrush, and toothpaste, Q-tips, razor, and blades
- Hairbrush

Other necessary personal items include toiletries and bedding, etc. These are additional things listed on an RV checklist to take into consideration.
