

MOTORHOME CHECKLIST

1. **HEIGHT- 11Ft- Most Gas station overhead covers are high enough to clear, but pay attention. Gas filler is on the left side- Unleaded 87- uses grey key to unlock**
2. **WIDTH- Pay attention with your "swing" (the length behind the rear wheels). Especially pulling away from structures**
3. **DRIVING- She drives like a large truck. Plenty of power. Cruise works well on flat roads and small hills. Larger hills, take it off cruise control as not to over rev the engine (she will downshift and rev over 4000 rpm)**
4. **OPERATION- All operation manuals for coach are provided. Please read as necessary.**
 - A. **30 Amp service works for plugging in/50 amp service is preferred but not necessary. DO NOT RUN GENERATOR IF PLUGGED INTO RV SHORE POWER!!**
 - B. **If you choose to run external water, there are hoses/ filters available under the coach that screw on to external faucets. I do not recommend drinking the water from the coach or external service water. Suggest you bring bottled/purified water. Its ok to shower/wash dishes etc.**
 - C. **If you are parked and have the opportunity to utilize the sewer, use it. Attach hose, run hose to dump and open Black water(first) and Gray water (second) and leave attached while parked.**
 - D. **Slide out works on Generator or Shore power (plugged into electrical circuit). It will not extend or retract under battery power. If for some reason the Slide out fails, there are 2 crank handles under the coach which will allow you to manually retract the slide out. DO NOT DRIVE COACH WITH SLIDE OUT EXTENDED.**
 - E. **There are leveling blocks in a box to level coach if necessary.**
 - F. **The Awning functions but it is difficult to use. I have provided a pop up awning under the coach. Please fold and repackage after use.**
 - G. **I have loaded firewood, charcoal, portable BBQ, some chairs etc for your use.**
 - H. **Normal usage off grid a family of 4 will fill the black/gray water and empty the fresh water in about 4 days. There is a meter that will tell you how much resources you have.**
 - I. **If you run strictly off battery for a couple days, run the generator every couple days to keep all the batteries charged.(15-30 min) There is a switch to the left of the steering wheel that will run music for the coach.**
 - J. **DO NOT LEAVE WATER PUMP ON CONTINUOUSLY. Shut off when not in use**
 - K. **Refrigerator will run off propane or generator/electricity. Leave in Auto mode for best service. While driving it will run on propane and will operate on electricity when plugged in or when running generator. Make sure refrigerator doors are closed prior to driving.**
 - L. **Hot water heater takes 10/15 min to heat up. Shut off when not in use. Runs on propane.**
 - M. **Heater works off propane and fan will run off battery power for heat. A/C works from Generator or Shore power only.**
 - N. **Couch makes into bed like Futon. Dining table drops to make bed.**
 - O. **Microwave/convection oven works on generator or shore power only. Take metal tray out before microwave usage.**
 - P. **Coffee pot/electrical outlets runs on Generator or shore power.**
 - Q. **Stove is propane and requires no electrical power.**

- R. There is a small tool box, axe and some necessary support equipment under the coach.
 - S. Please do not take this coach on the Dalton Hwy (above the Arctic circle) Denali Hwy between Paxton and Cantwell or the gravel portions to Kennecott mine (AK hwy 10). Its unimproved, very rough and there are limited services.
5. Return-
- A. Fill fuel and propane
 - B. Empty Black and Gray water
 - C. Remove all bedding and place on couch
 - D. Empty trash
 - E. If you have dirty dishes leave them in the sink.
 - F. Please respect this coach as if its your own. We want you to enjoy your Alaska adventure. Please let us know how we can do better and service our customers.
